Overview	Students will research an assigned symbol of the United States and prepare a short report or video teaching about the symbol.
Objective	Social Studies Standard 1.T3.2: Demonstrate understanding of the ways people show pride in belonging to the United States by recognizing and explaining the meaning of unifying symbols, phrases, and songs.
Materials	Students can reference online research, books, conduct personal interviews, or watch informational television shows. The completed project will require basic writing/coloring materials and/or the ability to produce a short video of a student presenting their information.
